No-Cost Attestation Preparation for Eligible Providers

Need additional help meeting Meaningful Use standards?

Purdue Healthcare Advisors continues its efforts to guide Medicaid-eligible healthcare providers toward Electronic Health Records (EHR) Meaningful Use (MU) standards with a program that provides a combination of remote and on-site services.

Providers eligible to benefit under the Medicaid MU Assistance Program are Indiana-based, ambulatory organizations practicing in:

- small groups/independent practices;
- Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs);
- Community Health Clinics (CHCs);
- Rural Health Clinics (RHCs);
- Community Mental Health Centers (CMHCs); or
- ambulatory practices employed by a Critical Access Hospital

AND

...participating in the Meaningful Use programs under Medicaid or Medicare*.

MU Program Year 2017

- The EHR reporting period must be completed within calendar year 2017.
 - All returning participants will attest to a 90day reporting period during January 1, 2017 to December 31, 2017.
- All participants are required to use 2014 Edition certified EHR technology or newer, and attest to a single set of objectives/measures.
 - EPs have a single set of 10 objectives.
 - EH/CAHs have a single set of 9 objectives.

MU HELP DESK

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In October of 2014, PHA and the Indiana Family and Social Services Administration (FSSA) partnered to receive a 90/10 matching grant from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. The \$2.3M in funding extended MU services to Medicaid-eligible EPs until 2017. In March 2017, PHA and the FSSA were awarded an additional \$3.6M to continue the program for two more years as well as expand the eligibility requirements.
